\*Recognizing the letters in our name and gluing beans on it.

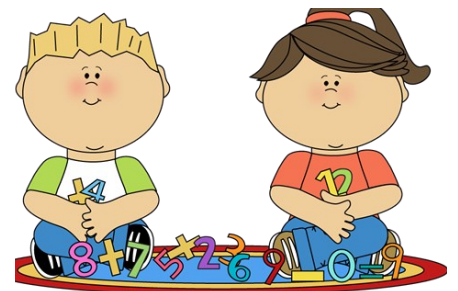
### Daily 5 Goal:
